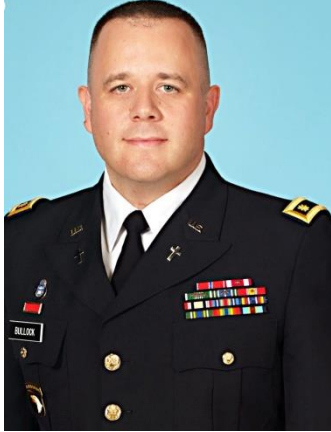


Chaplain (Lieutenant Colonel) Scott M. Bullock

Chaplain Scott M. Bullock has served in the U.S. Army since taking a commission as a Chaplain Candidate in September 1994. Raised in Michigan, he was ordained a minister of gospel at First Baptist Church of Sterling Heights and is endorsed to the Army Chaplaincy by the Foundations Baptist Fellowship International. Married to Kara Priest Bullock since June 1998, they have two children: Jonathan and Jinnea.

Chaplain Bullock is a graduate of Bob Jones University (B.A., 1993 and M.Div., 1997). He is a graduate of the Chaplain Officer Basic, Career and Lieutenant Colonel Courses and the Command and General Staff College (ILE).

Initially as an Army Reservist and since entering Active Duty in January 1998, Chaplain Bullock's assignments included: 2nd Battalion, 58th Infantry Regiment and 317th Engineer Battalion, 3rd Infantry Division at Fort Benning, GA; 3rd Squadron, 6th Cavalry Brigade (Air Attack) at Camp Humphreys, Korea; 326th Engineer Battalion and 106th Transportation Battalion, 101st Airborne Division at Fort Campbell, KY; 2nd Battalion, 39th Infantry Regiment and Instructor-Developer at the U.S. Army Chaplain Center and School, Fort Jackson, SC; 160th Signal Brigade at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait; 93rd Signal Brigade at Fort Eustis, VA; Deputy Chaplain for the Cyber Center of Excellence and Army Garrison Fort Gordon, GA; and Deputy Command Chaplain at the U.S. Army Cyber Command (ARCYBER) at Fort Belvoir, VA. He currently serves as the Command Chaplain for the U.S. Army Contracting Command (ACC) at Redstone Arsenal, AL.

Chaplain Bullock is the recipient of the Bronze Star Medal, the Meritorious Service Medal (4OLC), the Army Commendation Medal (4OLC), the Army Achievement Medal (2OLC), and the Meritorious Unit Commendation. He is a recipient of the Honorable Order of St. Christopher awarded by the Army Transportation Corps.
