Chaplain Scott Matthew Bullock has served in the U.S. Army since taking a commission as a Chaplain Candidate in September 1994. Raised in Michigan, he was ordained a minister of the gospel at First Baptist Church of Sterling Heights and is endorsed to the Army Chaplaincy by the Foundations Baptist Fellowship International. Married to Kara Priest Bullock since June 1998, they have two children: Jonathan (Air Defense Artillery Officer) and Jinnea (BJU English Education major).



Chaplain Bullock is a graduate of Bob Jones University (B.A., 1993 and M.Div., 1997).
